



## First 2023 Teacher Only Day Cheat Sheet

For support with the first 2023 Teacher Only Day (Monday 24 April - Friday 5 May 2023)

Over the past few years, Aotearoa New Zealand has undergone significant changes to its educational landscape through three major reforms: the Curriculum Refresh - Te Mātaiaho, NCEA Change Programme, and Reform of Vocational Education.

These reforms are significant and aim to address some of the challenges facing New Zealand's education system. The Curriculum Refresh aims to ensure that the curriculum is relevant, up-to-date, and reflects the values of New Zealand society, while the NCEA Change Programme aims to make the NCEA system more flexible and responsive to student needs. The Reform of Vocational Education aims to ensure that the vocational education and training system is better aligned with the needs of industry and provides learners with clear pathways to employment.

While these reforms are still in progress and their full impact is yet to be seen, they represent a significant shift in New Zealand's education system and have the potential to shape the future of education in the country.

## The Curriculum Refresh - Te Mātaiaho

The Curriculum Refresh, which began in 2021 and is set to be implemented by the beginning of 2026, aims to modernise the New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa (the Māori-medium curriculum). The technology learning area is currently being refreshed and involves extensive consultation with teachers, students, and communities.

## The NCEA Change Programme

The NCEA Change Programme, which was introduced in 2018 and is set to be fully implemented in 2023, aims to improve the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) system by reducing complexity, increasing flexibility, and ensuring that students have a broad range of learning opportunities. The programme includes changes such as fewer credits required to achieve NCEA, more opportunities for students to achieve NCEA through vocational education and training, and a new literacy and numeracy requirement for NCEA Level 1.

Updated material for 2023 is in the process of being published on the NCEA website, and finalised material for 2024 will be published later this year."

#### Standards changing from Draft to "Active"

The pilot standards will be listed in the <u>Directory of Assessment Standards (DAS)</u>. The Directory of Assessment Standards (DAS) lists all quality assured unit and achievement standards, known collectively as 'assessment standards'. The assessment standards listed on the DAS can contribute to national qualifications. The standards that will be available for use next year will not likely be changed from draft until implementation in December 2023.

## The Reform of Vocational Education (RoVE)

The Reform of Vocational Education, which began in 2019, aims to create a more unified, accessible, and responsive vocational education and training system. The reform involves merging the 16 polytechnics and institutes of technology into a single entity called Te Pūkenga - New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology (NZIST), and creating Industry Training Organizations (ITOs) to work with employers and employees to develop qualifications and training programs that meet the needs of specific industries.
